Family Prayer Picnic

One suggestion for a possible prayer activity:

Prayer Fishing





Cut out fish shapes and decorate one side. On the reverse, write the names of family members; friends; people affected by Coronavirus; key workers; etc.

Attach a paperclip to the mouth of each fish.

Make a fishing rod using a stick, string and a small magnet or a hook made from a bent paper clip, and go fishing!

As you examine your catch, pray for the person or group of people named on each fish. Have fun!

Older children and youth may prefer to create a special space set aside for personal and family prayer. A small table could be used. The aim is to gather together a few items which help us to be still and focus on God as we spend time with Him in prayer.

The prayer space may include a Bible, candle and possibly some natural objects that remind us of God's amazing creation.

There are endless opportunities for creative and artistic ideas to make your prayer space personal and meaningful to your family.

May your space become a place where you will encounter God; a place of peace and blessing – enjoy!
